I am proud and honored to present the achievements of the Young Women's Alliance 2021-2022 Leadership Team in the Annual Impact Report. The dedication to furthering YWA's mission was unwavering from the Board, chairs and volunteers. Together, we were able to reach new heights as an organization and elevate our impact in the community. Highlights include:

- Doubled membership base to 580 women
- Released a 3-year Diversity, Equity and Belonging roadmap that is integrated across all pillars of the organization
- Partnered with Girls Empowerment Network on a mentorship program for Del Valle students
- Awarded five \$5000 scholarships to Del Valle High School seniors seeking higher education
- Raised a record of \$51,000 during peer-to-peer fundraising campaign

Our greatest strength is the incredible group of women who work tirelessly to support, empower, and connect the next generation of women leaders. I know that the contributions from this year's leadership team will provide the organization with an even stronger future. 




The YWA Impact

- Awarded \$200,000+ in scholarships to young women with financial need seeking higher education
- Given \$60,000+ in community grants to nonprofit organizations aligned with our mission

- Volunteered over 13,000 cumulative hours through our membership volunteer events
- Created 380+ mentor/mentee relationships through our YWA

Through donations to the YWA Future Women Leaders Fund and revenue generated from membership, YWA supports, empowers, and connects women through programs that:





Fundraising Success for the Future Women Leaders Fund



Every year we mobilize our members to participate in our annual **Peer to Peer Fundraising** campaign. This year's campaign **fundraised** ~\$51,000 with a record 89 members participating!

The Austin Under 40 Awards, our largest annual fundraiser, celebrates Austin's emerging professionals and mentors. This gala gathers business and community leaders and social tastemakers to dine and dance. Co-hosted with YMBL, proceeds benefit Austin Sunshine Camps and the FWLF. We were able to hold a scaled back event this year after cancelling the 2020 gala due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This year's event raised \$22,000 and honored 16 outstanding community leaders.



- More than 50% of new members were referrals



Mentorship in YWA Connect

YWA Connect was created with one goal in mind: To connect women who are established community leaders and professionals with YWA Members to help create the next generation of women leaders. Through this nine-month program, we aim to give both our mentors and mentees the resources needed to grow professionally and personally.

Founded in 2012, this exclusive program has grown from five initial mentorship pairs to a total of 80 pairs in 2022!









YWA on the Fairway



In continuation with the success of YWA's Golf program, 155 members participated in one or more of over 35 small-group lessons offered. These lesson continue to provide YWA members with a foundation of experience and confidence to participate in golf outings with their male counterparts and positively impact their career.

In November 2021, YWA hosted the Inaugural YWA on the Fairway. This was YWA's first golf tournament open for public registration. The 2021-2022 Events Committee was able to secure \$6,300 in monetary sponsorships and profited \$5,776 in total. It was a sold out tournament with over 100+ players in attendance.

In March 2022, YWA hosted the inaugural Beautifully Made fundraiser. The 2021-2022 Events Committee was able to secure \$8,650 in monetary sponsorships and profited \$20,420 in total.

Our unique art gallery event showcased five five women leaders in the Austin area that exemplify the values of YWA. We partnered with local organization atxGALS to honor each award recipient with a custom art piece that was shown at the event along with other one-of-a-kind art pieces from the women artists of the collective.



In 2022, YWA invested \$25,000 back into the community through our scholarship program!

We strategically partnered with Del Valle ISD to place focus on a part of the community that could benefit most from YWA's support. After receiving 30 applications, we awarded five \$5,000 scholarships. Our goal is to help these women through their first year of school!

In the Community

One of the pillars of YWA is to serve the community that has helped our members thrive. The **Community Impact Committee** actively seeks out and organizes special YWA group volunteer events with organizations throughout Austin. In addition, members are encouraged and supported in volunteering with nonprofits whose mission they connect with and care about.

Our community service committee provided safe ways for our members to give back to the community through small group in person events, and larger outdoor opportunities. This year there were nearly 80 volunteer events for members with 14 different local nonprofit partners.

This year, YWA members volunteered around **2,000** hours of service to Austin-area nonprofits and organizations.







We are proud of our continued partnership with the Girls Empowerment Network (GIRLS). GIRLS' mission is to support teen and pre-teen girls and equip them with the skills they need to emerge from adolescence as confident, successful young women.

As our non-profit partner, we help provide an ongoing, weekly volunteer opportunity that allows our members to form encouraging and caring relationships through the Girl **Connect** program. Our members meet with their mentees every week for a semester to help the girls to increase their self-efficacy, resiliency, and create positive connections with peers and role models. This provides a great opportunity for our members to hone their own mentorship skills and give back to the community.

YWA is thrilled to support GEN and Girl Connect this year through both volunteerism and an \$8,000 grant that contributes to the operational costs of the program for a Del Valle school.






Why Our Members Love Mentoring with GIRLS

"It would have been life changing if I had this opportunity when I first came to the US and I would love to be that person for someone."





